When this sweet kitten was found in a community member's backyard, she was in horrible shape. Her front leg was mostly missing, leaving her with a large open wound. It is likely that she was attacked by another animal. She was scared, all alone, and in so much pain.

Thanks to the support of friends like you, we are able to respond quickly in emergency situations like this one. Chloe was rushed to Pasadena Humane, where our team wasted no time prepping her for emergency surgery. Sadly, her wounds were so severe that we were not able to save what was left of her injured leg. Our veterinarians expertly amputated her leg and skillfully closed her wound to prevent infections.

Chloe has experienced so much trauma in her short life, but with your help, she was able to get the care she deserved. Despite her hardships, her playful spirit was never dampened. As she began her road to recovery, she has adjusted well to her new life as a tripod. It wasn't long before she was adopted by a wonderful family, where she will continue to grow and heal in safety and comfort. We were stuck at a dead end, unable to identify his owner.

Luckily, Frankie's adorable face soon caught the eye of one of our Animal Resource Specialists, Destiny. She remembered seeing a post about a lost dog on social media — a couple's poodle had slipped away from them at LAX about a week earlier and looked exactly like Frankie!

While it seemed far-fetched that a dog lost at LAX might turn up in Pasadena, Destiny messaged the couple with Frankie's intake photo. They came to the shelter the next morning and confirmed that the dog in our care was indeed their Frankie. The reunion was a tearful one, and the couple was full of joy when they realized their beloved dog was coming home.

It is thanks to your support that we are able to reunite lost pets with their families as quickly as possible. We gave Frankie a microchip before he left, ensuring that should he get loose again, his family will always be able to find him.

NEW DIGS FOR CATS & WILDLIFE

At Pasadena Humane, we are constantly improving the lives of animals who are sheltered with us. With your support, we are making some exciting habitat upgrades for the cats and wild animals in our care.

Thanks to animal lovers like you, our two communal cat rooms in the Neely Cat Center have been reimagined in collaboration with the help of cat furniture designer, Square Paws. The new decor is inspired by Pasadena's iconic Craftsman and Spanish Colonial Revival architecture styles with a cat-centric twist. Each room features plenty of vertical space, nooks and crannies for napping, and even a cat grass garden planted by volunteers. The building materials used are durable, easy to clean and are engineered to engage and enrich our feline residents' five senses.

But that's not all! Your support provided necessary resources to make updates to our Sandra J. Goodspeed Wildlife Center. We recently completed construction on a new outdoor modular transitional habitat that will be used by many different species. Juvenile squirrels can climb in one area while fledgling birds test their wings in another, all learning behaviors that will help them survive once they are released back to the wild.

ORPHANED OWL GETS A SECOND CHANCE

When orphaned baby animals arrive at our Sandra J. Goodspeed Wildlife Center, we don't always know their backstory. But in the case of a baby screech owl, a good Samaritan witnessed a peregrine falcon swoop out of the sky and attack the owl's parents, killing them immediately. Surprisingly, the baby was left unharmed – but without his parents to care for him, his chances of survival were slim.

The good Samaritan texted our Wildlife Helpline to request assistance for the poor baby owl, who was now all alone and very vulnerable. Our Animal Control Officer rushed to the scene and quickly transported the owl back to Pasadena Humane, where our wildlife team gave him fluids, food, and a safe place to rest.

As it turns out, we already had another little screech owl in our care. Unlike our new arrival, the resident owl's past was a mystery, but our goal for each was the same – rehabilitation and release back to the wild. These two orphans were transferred to the Ojai Raptor Center where they will be raised together in a large flight enclosure, strengthening their wings and eventually growing into majestic adult owls.

Your vital support allows us to respond quickly to emergency situations like this one. Thanks to you, we can take in orphaned baby wildlife at a moment's notice, giving them the specialized care they need to one day return to their wild homes.
